# LOEW Lecture Series at Becker College

The Franklin M. Loew Lecture Series is a public forum that invites scholars and professionals to present lectures on topics of interest and importance to the Becker College community and the public.

On November 8 Massachusetts voters will be asked to cast a ballot for or against Ballot Question 3 regarding conditions for farm animals. The question proposes a law which would prohibit any farm owner or operator from knowingly confining any breeding pig, calf raised for veal, or egg-laying hen in a way that prevents the animal from lying down, standing up, fully extending its limbs or turning around freely. It also would prohibit Massachusetts businesses from purchasing goods from any farm owner or operator who does not adhere to those rules.
