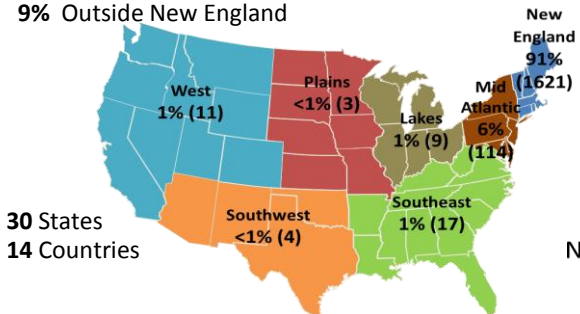

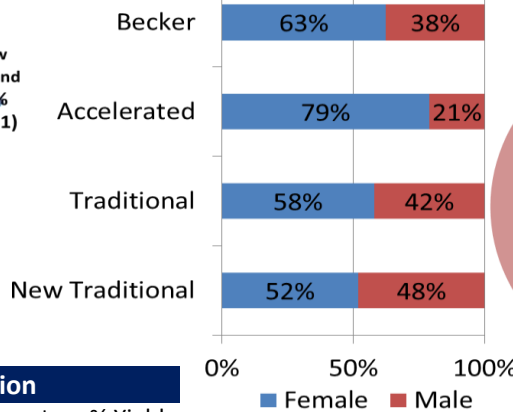
Student Geography

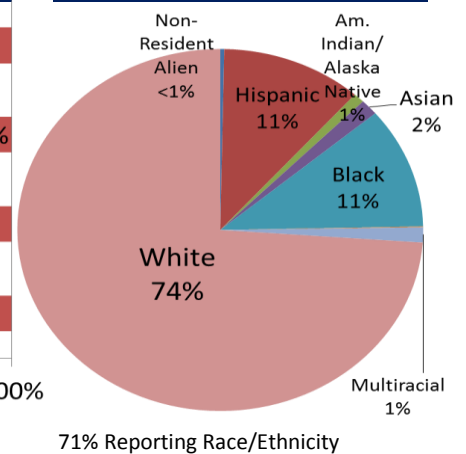

Student Gender



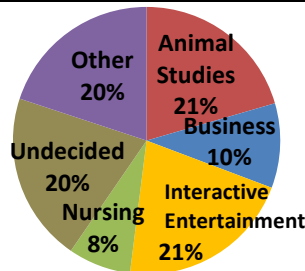
Student Race/Ethnicity

Largest Majors Fall 2011 New Traditional



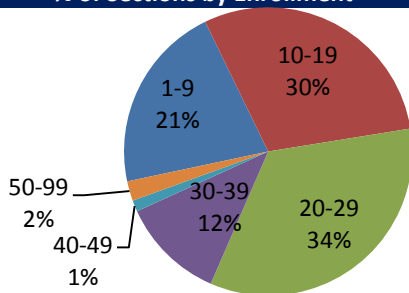

% of Sections by Enrollment

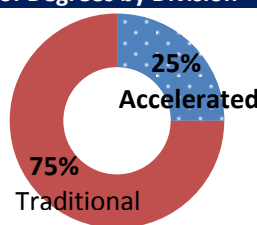

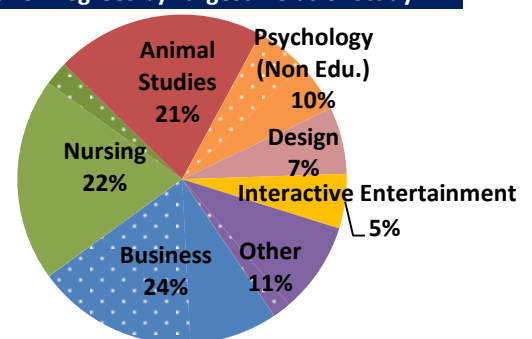
Degrees Awarded 2010-2011
